Sonata across four elements

- i) mountain stream with dipper
- ii) barn owl: dusk iii) desert flowers
- iv) wildfire

The **Sonata across four elements** was begun in 2004. It was initially inspired by an article in *Resurgence* magazine about a bird – the dipper – and its habitat, a fast-flowing stream. The writer was interested in the way in which the dipper could be seen as so deeply connected with this habitat as almost to embody it. This suggested a piece of music in which the flow of the 'water' and the bobbing and darting of the 'bird' were intertwined in various ways. Having written a fast piece of 'water music', it struck me that the other mediaeval elements – air, earth and fire - might be drawn upon for three further movements, to make a sonata with an ecological theme.
